³ Seniors must register for UNIV4AA0HS1 the term they plan to graduate (non-credit class for clearing graduation).

⁴ Students must receive a grade of "C" or better in all 3000 and 4000 level HDFS Required Major Core classes.

⁵ Students must attend a Mandatory Orientation Meeting and submit their applications two semesters in advance of the semester they intend to complete the HDFS Internship.

⁶ Students must coordinate their CHS Study Abroad with the Office of Academic Affairs, 266 Spidle Hall.

⁷ Students interested in earning Child Life Certification must complete 100 practicum/service learning hours and a 480 hour internship under a Certified Child Life Specialist (see <http://www.childlife.org/Certification>).
