- <sup>3</sup> Seniors must register for UNIV4AA0HS1 the term they plan to graduate (non-credit class for clearing graduation).
- <sup>4</sup> Students must receive a grade of "C" or better in all 3000 and 4000 level HDFS Required Major Core classes.
- <sup>5</sup> Students must attend a Mandatory Orientation Meeting and submit their applications two semesters in advance of the semester they intend to complete the HDFS Internship.
- <sup>6</sup> Students must coordinate their CHS Study Abroad with the Office of Academic Affairs, 266 Spidle Hall.
