The undergraduate Certificate in Health Equity Science (CHES) is administered through the Department of Human Development and Family Science in the College of Human Sciences (CHS). Students completing this certificate program will have a strong understanding of the role of social context in generating disease risks and disparities in health between groups. Students will also learn how this corpus of knowledge can be translated into health-promoting policies and community-level interventions.

To obtain approval for these credits to count towards the Health Equity Science certificate, submit the following materials to Dr. Thomas Fuller-Rowell (tfr1@auburn.edu). Students should submit a one page description of the time commitment and primary activities of the internship or practicum (signed by the student and her/his supervisor) and a one page description of how the activities are relevant to health equity science topics. Students completing thesis credits to meet the certificate requirements should submit their thesis proposal for preliminary approval before it is completed and the completed thesis for final approval.
