Discover musical ideas every provider can use!

Jim Gill will share a variety of interactive and enriching activities including music play, bookmaking, and book dramatization that providers can incorporate into their repertoire. He explains how certain literacy “building blocks,” such as auditory acuity and phonemic and phonological awareness, are best developed through active engagement in word play and rhyming games. And he demonstrates that a playful approach to sharing the joys of language and books needn’t end after kindergarten. Through music and play utilized with preschoolers as well as with infants, toddlers, and parents, the audience will learn about the many correlations between music play, literacy and various domains of early childhood development. Connections between music and early literacy become clear as Jim Gill shares clever word play and rhymes in the context of active movement games.

Participants will find many new ideas to enhance story times and children’s programming and will leave the session with a play-based approach to literacy that offers unique learning opportunities for all children during the early years of life.
